Two of our team members (Carla & Julie) are pictured with Bishop Malone dressed up in bathing suits to support the Rally Day theme: A Day at The Beach!






## JOIN US FOR OUR UPCOMING EVENTS

The gifts cards were delivered to the Settlement during our Volunteers in Mission Trip in September and were greatly appreciated by the Settlement. (The Settlement director had tears of appreciation in his eyes when he opened the envelope and saw the amount of our donations.) The donations were to be distributed between various programs run by the Settlement, including Outreach (for the Christmas program), Maternal Infant Health Outreach Worker (MIHOW), Food Pantry, Seniors assistant programs, Youth groups, and After School programs. Our team was able to make improvements at the Settlement Campus through several projects including building deck outside а new Administrative Building, assembling shelving units in the Thrift store, cleaning and sealing a stairway in the Community Center, and various sorting projects in the Thrift store. Thank you to the congregation for your continued support. Although we know it is a lot to commit too, we are always looking for additional volunteers to help us in this cause.

## NEW ADMINISTRATION BUILDING... Clinic Conversion to Administration Building

For a number of years, Henderson Settlement operated a clinic staffed by part-time and volunteer dental and medical personnel. This ministry never really developed the following that we anticipated, and the facility was closed in 2014. Since that time, the building has been largely vacant, seeing only periodic use for a few days each year by our volunteer dental staff. To best use this building to support our ministry into the

coming decade, it was decided to transform this building into a refurbished, single-story Administration Building.

With this change, we will gain safe and adequate parking space, an entry without steps, a lobby area in which to greet and properly connect community members, volunteers, and guests, we also plan to upgrade our telephone system to a more current and reliable platform that has technical support and replacement parts available. One of major projects undertaken by our Henderson Settlement Mission Team was to build a deck for the newly renovated Administrative Building.







The Henderson Settlement THRIFT STORE needed some attention to enhance their ability to serve the community. The old shelves were removed and eight (8) new shelves were put up.

Henderson Settlement provides the community of Frakes, KY with the opportunity to purchase good clothing, usable household items, working small appliances and furniture at a very low cost. The Frakes Thrift Store also carries food and drink options, which are bought at discount and sold for a reasonable price. Through donations, and in cooperation with Community Services, we can provide clothing, appliances, and furniture at no cost to those who cannot afford to pay. Items that are holiday in nature are always desperately needed.



Women of our church provided material and made 402 Christmas stockings. In addition to the Christmas Stockings, small toys and stuffed animals were donated to help fill some of them. These stockings will be given to the children of the area at their annual Christmas party. Our church is helping a United Methodist church in northern Michigan with this project. They had been doing it on their own for years, but the number needed had greatly increased.
