


ADVENT BIBLE STUDY: The Improbable Story

Because the story of Jesus' birth was nothing like anyone expected: A baby... born in a forgotten corner of the Mediterranean...


To save us from sins we did not even know we needed saving.

contributing monetary donations of any amount. These stores offer food, clothing, toys, and gas giving parents the dignity of choosing items that best suit their family's needs.


How You Can Help:



In the heart of Cedar Lake, Indiana, a beacon of compassion shines every Wednesday morning. The **Project Love Food Pantry**, operated by the Cedar Lake United Methodist Church, opens its doors from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM, offering more than just food—it offers dignity, respect, and hope to those in need1.

The pantry serves the southern half of Lake County, including Hanover, Center, Winfield, West Creek, Cedar Creek, and Eagle Creek Townships. With 5,000 individuals living below the poverty level in this area, Project Love estimates that 125 people per week may need food assistance1.

Project Love Food Pantry is more than a place to get groceries—it is a community lifeline. Whether you are seeking help or looking to give back, this pantry is a powerful reminder of what love in action looks like.

Financial Update – Year-to-Date Through September 30, 2025

Dear Church Family,

As we enter the final quarter of 2025, we want to share a snapshot of our financial activity through September. Your generosity continues to make a meaningful impact, and we are grateful for every gift that supports the mission and ministry of First United Methodist Church.

Year-to-Date Overview:

DESCRIPTION	AMOUNT
Actual Income	\$ 483,809
Budgeted Expenses	\$ 529,148
Income vs. Budgeted Expenses	(\$45,339)
Actual Expenses	\$ 496,208
Actual Income vs. Actual Expenses	(\$ 12,399)

We were encouraged to see a modest increase in income over last year, and we have kept expenses well below budget. However, income remains below our projected needs, and expenses—while carefully managed—still exceed income.

Thanks to prudent stewardship, we have reserves to cover the shortfall for now. But as we look ahead, we ask everyone to prayerfully consider how they might help close the gap. Some discretionary costs can be trimmed, but essential expenses like staff payroll, utilities, and insurance must be maintained.
